



Overview:


- 40 students graduated from the BA (Hons) Accounting & Finance November 2021.
 - 82% of those that responded were in employment and 96% of those in employment were employed in graduate level employment.
 - 12% were undertaking further study
 - 3% were seeking employment and
 - 3% were unavailable for work.
- 96% of graduates are working in finance related roles in practice or industry.
 - 62% of those employed are working as trainee accountants in practice.
 - 17% are working in Financial Services.
 - 33% of graduates were employed in a Top 10 accounting firm.
- 21/28 (74%) of graduates secured roles that were advertised on the NCI jobs portal.
- 12 of the 28 (43%) of graduates secured roles with employers that came on campus.
