

New Full Time Students – Fee Payment

New full time undergraduate students are required to read the below carefully to self-assess their fee payment.

Please note that the payment system will show you the full outstanding amount, it does not deduct funding from SUSI or the Department of Education at this time so you must read the below carefully to assess what you need to pay. Do not panic when you see the outstanding amount on the system!

What are Student Fees?

For students categorised as Irish/EU, fees are made up of the following:

- 1. Tuition Fees
- 2. Student Contribution Fees
- 3. Gym Membership Fees

The Department of Education and Science fund the tuition fee on "Free Fees Courses"1.

Students can apply to SUSI to cover the cost of the Student Contribution Fee which is €3000 for the 2025/2026 academic year.

The Gym Membership fee is €80 and must be paid by all students, it is not funded by an external body.

¹ The only courses not covered by Free Fees at the National College of Ireland are the BA Hons in Psychology and the BA (Hons) in Early Childhood Education & Care

How do I calculate what I need to pay?

To make things as easy as possible we have outlined a number of scenarios below. Students will fall into 1 of these scenarios. Read the scenarios carefully to confirm what you must pay before proceeding to online registration.

Scenario 1: Full Time, Irish/EU, SUSI

- I am an Irish/EU student and lived in Ireland/EU for 3 of the last 5 years
- I am a full-time undergraduate student
- I have applied for/been awarded SUSI funding for the upcoming year
- I have not completed a full time course at this level in another institution previously

Total Payment Amount = €80.00

Scenario 2: Full Time, Irish EU, no SUSI

- I am an Irish/EU student and lived in Ireland/EU for 3 out of the last 5 years
- I am a full-time undergraduate student
- I did not apply for SUSI funding
- <u>Total Payment Amount = €3080.</u>

You can choose to pay this in full or;

- Pay €1580 in September and €1500 in December/January or
- Pay €680, sign a <u>direct debit form</u> and return to <u>fees@ncirl.ie</u>. The remainder of the fee will then be split into instalments.

Scenario 3: Full Time, Self-Funding (excludes BA Hons in Psychology)

- I am a full-time undergraduate student
- I did not apply for SUSI funding
- I may have undertaken a college course in a previous institution
- I may not be an Irish/EU student

On the below programmes you can choose to;

- 1. Pay the full "Amount Due" presented to you on screen
- **2.** Pay half the tuition fee + full gym membership fee (remaining fees will be due before semester 2 in January) **see table below**
- **3.** Pay 20% of the full outstanding amount **and** <u>sign a direct debit form</u> and return to <u>fees@ncirl.ie</u> The remainder of the fee will then be split into instalments.

Scenario 4: BA Hons in Psychology

Year 1 Fees: Tuition Fee €6250 + Gym Membership €80 = €6330

No SUSI funding

If you have not applied for SUSI funding or are not eligible for same you can pay in the following manner in order to be registered;

- 1. Pay the full outstanding amount €6330
- 2. Pay half the tuition fee (€3125) and full gym membership fee (€80) = €3205
- 3. Pay a 20% deposit of the tuition fee (€1250) and full gym membership fee (€80) = €1330 You must sign a direct debit form and return to fees@ncirl.ie the remainder of the fee will be split into instalments

SUSI funding

If you have applied to SUSI they may have already confirmed in writing what they are funding you. If so you can calculate what you need to pay based off what they will fund you.

For Example: If SUSI confirm they are funding you €3000; €6250 (Tuition Fee) - €3000 = €3250 + €80 gym membership = **Amount Payable** €3330

- The payment of €3330 can be split into two payments due in September and again December/January
- Or you can pay 20% of outstanding amount and <u>sign a direct debit form</u> and return to fees@ncirl.ie the remainder of the fee will be split into instalments.

Scenario 5: BA Hons in Early Childhood Education & Care

Year 1 Fees: Tuition Fee €4800 + Gym Membership €80 = €4880

No SUSI funding

If you have not applied for SUSI funding or are not eligible for same, you can pay in the followingmanner in order to be registered;

- 4. Pay the full outstanding amount €4880
- 5. Pay half the tuition fee(€2400) and full gym membership fee (€80) = €2480
- 6. Pay a 20% deposit of the tuition fee (€960) and full gym membership fee (€80) = €1040. You must sign a direct debit form and return to fees@ncirl.ie the remainder of the fee will be split into instalments

SUSI funding

If you have applied to SUSI they may have already confirmed in writing what they are funding you. If so you can calculate what you need to pay based off what they will fund you.


For Example: If SUSI confirm they are funding you €3000; €4800 (Tuition Fee) - €3000 = €1800 + €80 gym membership = **Amount Payable** €1880

- The payment of €1880 can be split into two payments due in September and again December/January
- o Or you can pay 20% of outstanding amount and sign a direct debit form and return to fees@ncirl.ie the remainder of the fee will be split into instalments.

Where do I go to Pay Fees?

You will need a credit/debit card to hand for this part of the process (please note that amex is not accepted).

- In order to pay your fees for the upcoming academic year you will need to login to MyDetails
- Remember your username is X + student number e.g. x12345678
- When you have logged in click on the "Courses tab"



• Click on the course that Starts in September 2025



• You will see a Pay Fees button associated with the upcoming year. Click on it.

Pay Fees – Additional Steps

• Before you can make a payment, you must ensure address details are correct and fill out any mandatory fields.

Fee Calculation Rules

- You will be asked to input the amount of fees you wish to pay. There is a minimum payment required depending on your student status. This is explained in the scenarios above.
- NOTE: THE "AMOUNT DUE" (BELOW) DOES NOT INCLUDE FUNDING YOU MAY RECEIVE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION OR SUSI SO YOU MUST READ THE ABOVE SCENARIOS CAREFULLY TO CALCULATE YOUR FEES PAYMENT.
