Community **Update 2021-22**

2021-22 was a year of growth and challenges for the Early Learning Initiative. It was a challenging year as we dealt with the continued impact of COVID-19, increased waiting lists for disability services, the Ukrainian refugee crisis and cost of living increases for children and families across Ireland. However, it was also a year of fantastic growth where we reached more families locally and nationally through our new National Centre and Dublin's Inner-City programmes. The National Centre supports communities across Ireland to deliver home visiting programmes, while our Dublin's Inner City programmes deliver wrap-around inclusive services to local children and families.

Our focus on at-risk children continued with 14,835 people engaging in an ELI's programmes in 2021-22. Satisfaction rates and learning indicators remain high with children's language, literacies and cognitive skills continuing to improve. While 2021-22 was a turbulent year for many families, our wonderful partners helped ensure that children and young people flourished despite the many challenges. A huge thank you from ELI to those partners who continue to support the educational and career aspirations of communities across Ireland.

Home visiting and family engagement programmes continued to provide support to families in 2021/22 with new programmes also being developed to support emerging needs of families.
