## Preponderance Rule

### 4.1.1.1 Guidelines for awarding under preponderance

Where a learner's overall average mark for the purpose of calculation of an award lies at a borderline, the rule of preponderance should be used. The preponderance rule should be used for all marks within $1 \%$ of the grade e.g. $69 \%$ in the case of $1_{\text {st }}$ Class honours. i.e. a learner reaching $69.5 \%$ will not automatically be uplifted unless more than half of the modules giving credit for the award stage have $1_{\text {st }}$ Class honours marks.
