Covid-19 Update



Do I need to travel to Ireland for my course?

Yes. As of January 2022, the Irish Government lifted many of the emergency restrictions in place due to the global pandemic. This means all students are now able to attend classes on-campus and **are required to travel to Ireland prior to the start of their course**. Please see NCI Covid-19 update [here](#).

Do I need proof of vaccination or a PCR test on arrival?

From Sunday 6 March 2022, travellers to Ireland are **not** required to show proof of vaccination, proof of recovery or a negative PCR test result upon [arrival](#).

There are no post-arrival testing or quarantine requirements for travellers to Ireland.

However, you will need to check the requirements to fly from your country and with your chosen airline.

What if I develop Covid-19 symptoms?

Any individual that develops COVID-19 symptoms while in Ireland should follow the [HSE guidance](#) (Health Service executive) in relation to isolation and undertaking antigen or PCR testing as appropriate.

If I am not fully vaccinated, could I get a vaccine in Ireland?

Yes, NCI students may receive a free vaccination or booster from [Hanover Medical](#).
