

# SELF-GUIDED CAMPUS & CITY TOUR

This guide is for international students who arrive late or wish to take a tour in their own time.

## 4<sup>th</sup> Floor

Start at the **International Office**, which is in room 4.24 on the 4<sup>th</sup> Floor. Please note you must schedule an appointment to meet a team member and working hours are Monday to Friday 9am to 5pm.



# CITY TOUR

## 1 NCI

The tour starts at NCI. The campus is located on Mayor Street, IFSC, D1.

Here you will find everything under one roof: all lecture theatres and classrooms, library, canteen, offices, student union and on-campus accommodation. (See campus tour)

The gym 'SV Fitness' is located just around the corner on Lower Mayor Street.

From the college walk towards the River Liffey and turn left towards Samuel Beckett Bridge, which looks like a harp. Cross the bridge, turn left again, walk straight along Sir John Rogerson's Quay. Take the third to your right into Forbes Street and the next on your right again into Lazer Lane.

## 2 Hanover Medical Centre

Hanover Medical Centre is located on 5 Lazer Lane, Grand Canal Dock, D2.

This is NCI's recommended medical centre and the college will only accept medical certs from the doctors in here. International students will receive a discounted consultation rate here.

From Hanover Medical walk back towards the river and turn left. Do not cross the river, stay on the south side. Walk straight along the river, past the Jeanie Johnston Famine ship and Custom House, all on the other side of the river on your right.

Walk past Tara Street Station on your left. Shortly after that you will see the INIS office on your left hand side.

## 3 INIS Office

The INIS Office –very often also referred to as GNIB Office– is on 13/14 Burgh Quay, D2.

This is where you need to go to complete your immigration registration, i.e. where you apply for your Irish Residency Permit (IRP).

From the INIS Office walk towards the big bridge a little further along the river.

This is O'Connell Bridge. Cross over the river here to O'Connell Street and walk straight on along the left hand side of the road. About halfway up O'Connell Street you will see an impressive building coming up on your left, the General Post Office (GPO) or An Post in Irish.

## 4 An Post / GPO

The General Post Office (GPO) is located on Lower O'Connell Street, D1.

This is the headquarters of An Post, the Irish Postal Service, and Dublin's principal post office. They offer various services from selling stamps, courier services and money transfers to postal orders.

A little further along O'Connell Street, also on the left hand side, past the Spire –a large pin-like monument– you will find the Dublin Bus Office.

## 5 Dublin Bus Office

The Dublin Bus Headquarters are located on 59 O'Connell Street Upper, D1.

Here you can get your Student Leap Card. This is a national student travel and discount card. It allows you to travel on bus, train and tram in Dublin as well as some nationwide services like Bus Eireann. To get your Leap Card here bring a completed application form, photo ID, NCI student card and €10 in cash.

From here the tour continues towards the end of O'Connell Street to Parnell Street.

## 6 Asian Stores

All along Parnell Street incl. Moore Street, you will find various shops and Asian supermarkets where you can buy food you will recognize from home. There are of course other areas in town where you find Asian shops however in and around Parnell Street you will find many of them in one place. Just off Parnell Street is the PPSN Office.

## 7 PPSN Centre

The PPSN Centre is also called Intreo Centre and is located on 197/199 Parnell Street, D1.

PPSN stands for Personal Public Service Number. All international students are required to have a PPS number in order to receive their award at the end of their studies. You can apply for a PPSN online.

Then walk towards the western end of Parnell Street.

Before you come to the end of Parnell Street, where the road forks, you will see a big cinema on your right hand side. This is Cineworld, the biggest cinema in Dublin.

Take a left turn and walk down Jervis Street or Wolfe Tone Street. This will bring you to Mary Street.

Mary Street/Henry Street is one of Dublin's most popular shopping areas. You will find several large shopping centres, department stores and individual shops here.

One of the big shopping centres on this street is the Jervis Shopping Centre.

## 8 Jervis Shopping Centre

Here you will find everything from clothing to food under one roof.

Walk into the shopping centre taking a right turn from Mary Street, keep to the right and leave the building on the opposite side where you will find the Jervis Luas stop.

## 9 Jervis Luas Stop

The Jervis Luas Stop marks the end of the tour. From here you can take the Luas back to NCI. Take the Luas into the direction of 'The Point' to get back to NCI if you need to.
