

# SHOPPING IN DUBLIN

In the following you will find information on shops and shopping centres in Dublin's north city centre to familiarize yourself with locations where you find the basic necessities like food, groceries, clothing etc.

## 1 Talbot Street

On Talbot Street you will find shops like Iceland, SuperValu and Dunnes for your daily groceries shopping and frozen food items etc. Iceland provides frozen food and other items at a very competitive price. There are certain food joints on the way like Pizza Shops, Noodle Shop etc. for cost effective take away and meal deals.

From Talbot Street follow way towards O'Connell Street for basic necessities like Food, Clothing etc.

## 2 O'Connell Street

On O'Connell Street next to the General Post Office (GPO) you will find Penneys which is famous for cost effective clothing and other related items.

Next to Penneys you will find Easons. This is a large book shop and is a good stop for all your stationery requirements. Easons also offers discounts for students if you are carrying your college student ID while making the purchase.

In the area you will also find eateries like Subway, McDonald's and some Chinese restaurants and take aways.

From O'Connell Street the next stop is Henry Street and Parnell Street for cost friendly daily food/ groceries.

## 3 Henry / Parnell Street

On Henry Street you find all sorts of large department stores (like Arnotts, for example) and various shops to buy clothing, toiletries, pharmaceuticals, gifts, books, technical items, some low cost Euroshops etc.

An Ice Cream shop called Gino's is a good landmark and great spot to treat yourself.

Around the corner from Gino's you will find Moore Street with a good number of ethnic shops where you will get all different ethnic foods and groceries. This is also called Asian Market.

Supermarkets like LIDL, TESCO and ALDI are located on Parnell Street. These supermarkets are great for low groceries and daily necessities.

Food joints like KFC, McDonald's are also on the way. Walking towards the end of Parnell Street you will find a large cinema, Cineworld.

Now walk left towards Henry Street/ Jervis Shopping Centre.

## 4 Jervis Shopping Centre

Jervis Shopping Centre is located on Henry Street which is there for all your needs.

For food/groceries you have M&S, Tesco and Burger King and other cafes and other various food joints.

For clothes you will find a large number of shops.

For cosmetics and personal items make your way to Boots which is one stop shop for all Medicinal and Cosmetics requirements. Boots also offer discount to students if you are carrying BOOTS Card and your Student Leap Card.

There might be a point of interest to you which is called **TEMPLE BAR FOOD MARKET** (on the south side of the city) which is organised every Saturday from 10am to 4 pm.
