


## Timetables - https://www.ncirl.ie/Students/Timetables

**Timetables are live** on the timetable website. This guide shows you how to navigate the Timetable website.

### **Important Notes**

- Timetables are subject to change and regular checking of programme timetables is recommended.
- MyTimetable App is your personalised timetable and the best way to view your timetable.
  - This app is only available to registered students i.e., students who have submitted their Registration Form and have paid their fees in full / have a full offer .
- School of Computing Masters Students have Bootcamp classes which are delivered 'remote' which is online for the first few weeks on Wednesday afternoons and Saturdays.





## Attend your classes and check your student email for updates from your School

### **School of Business**

- **Block Delivery** for all Programmes, except MSc Finance. This means that classes are delivered **intensively** for 2 to 3 weeks then move on to next subject. First three modules for the semester are usually Core modules
- Electives usually the late module of the semester and the school will inform you what electives are available and how to select them.

Check Moodle as your lecturer may have uploaded some notes already and given you some and pre-reading

### **School of Computing**

- Normal delivery i.e. modules delivered over the semester
- Some programmes have been divided into different groups and the MyTimetable App shows your group. MSc Data has A, B & C groups, MSc Cloud has A & B groups and MSc Cyber has A & B groups
- The school will inform you about electives, streams and bootcamp classes



### **Key Dates & Academic Calendar**

- The <u>Academic Calendar</u> is published from September until August the following year. Once published it rarely changes.
- Important note on programme delivery for January intake students
- School of Computing Programmes delivered over one year from January 2023 to January 2024
   with graduation in Spring 2024



• School of Business Programmes delivered over 20 months from January 2023 to August 2024 with graduation in November 2024.

## **Programme Cycle, Sequence & Timing**

- Students must follow the programme cycle, sequence & timing for their intake e.g.
  - Jan 23 intake for School of Computing Programmes cycle, sequence & timing



School of Business Programmes cycle, sequence & timing for the Jan 23 intake



 Students who don't attempt an assessment are marked as NP (Not Present) and considered a missed attempt



## **Programme Cycle, Sequence & Timing**

- Students who don't succeed at the first attempt or the first repeat sitting (including missed attempts) **MUST register to repeat by attending**.
  - This only applies for subjects not completed
  - NCI requires students to repeat by attending as it gives students the best opportunity to succeed, and if on a student visa, immigration require students to attend
  - Must register within the timelines, usually within a week of results being published



### **Student Health**

To understand how the medical system works in Ireland read the article on the NCI Support Hub 'How do I get help with medical'?

- Must go to a GP (General Practitioner) to get referred to hospital / specialist
- NCI Medical Centre is Hanover Medical Centre and when making an appointment you must confirm you are a full time NCI Student and show your student ID card.

### Student Health - NCI Medical Centre

- Hanover Medical Tel: 01 6750040 is available for all full-time students a reduced concession fee of
  €15 for a consultation during the academic year
  - January Intakes (School of Computing) From first week of class in January until 31 December the same year
  - January Intakes (School of Business) From first week of class in January until 31 August of the following year
- Outside of these times Students pay the full price of €70 to visit the GP.
- Cancellations or No Shows: If you cancel (less than 2 hours) or fail to attend your appointment you will be charged €35 and will lose your reduced concession fee for future doctor visits.
- Attend Hanover Medical for COVID Vaccination and Booster, which are FREE.
- In Case of Emergency Do you know what number to ring Emergency Services?


