Ireland is the 12th most peaceful country in the world (Source – Global Peace Index, 2020) (Australia = 13, United Kingdom = 42, USA = 121).

Ireland is 12th out of 40 countries for personal safety (Source – OECD, 2019) (Australia = 27th, New Zealand = 26th, UK = 11th).

People from over 170 countries call Ireland their home. Irish people are warm and friendly and will go out of their way to help and support those they meet.

Ireland is ranked 12th out of 40 countries for life satisfaction (Source – OECD, 2019) (UK = 18th).

We take care of those around us! Ireland is ranked 5th out of 40 countries for the quality of support networks.

We are the only English speaking country in the European Union and in the Eurozone.

Ireland has its own native language called Gaelic (Irish) but students are not required to learn this. Everyday life, business and education is done in English.

Working in Ireland

Work Part Time During Your Studies

A study visa will allow students to work 20 hours per week during the semester and 40 hours per week in the semester breaks (1 month in winter and 3 months in summer).

The minimum wage is €10.20 per hour.

Part time jobs will typically be in shops, restaurants, hotels, call centers, care homes etc.

Graduate Work Visa Completion of a Level 8 Honours Bachelor Degree = 1 year graduate work visa Completion of a Level 9 Masters Degree = 2 year graduate work visa

Students are not required to show proof of employment when applying for their graduate work visa. The visa is not tied to any sector or salary level.

4 year visa (Stamp 1A) for Trainee Accountants available

Average graduate starting salary €30,409 per year (Source – Grad Ireland, 2019)

Finding employment in Ireland

Students will work with the Career's department of their college / university to prepare for their future career. Students will prepare a resume, practice interview skills and meet potential employers at career events and fairs.

Graduate jobs are advertised in many ways. One of the most popular websites is Grad Ireland - <u>https://gradireland.com/</u>

Students can also look for jobs through their college / university career portal or on job websites such as <u>www.irishjobs.ie</u> , <u>www.jobs.ie</u> and through LinkedIn.

Students may also approach their preferred companies with their resume to seek job opportunities.

International students are in demand in Ireland, particularly for jobs that require second languages.

Many students are successful in securing long term work visas through company visa sponsorship, in particular students who are skilled in IT or Finance.

Visas and Immigration

Ireland has a two step immigration process

Step 1 – Apply for a Long Stay Study visa (those that need an entry visa only)

Not all nationalities require an entry visa – please check here http://inis.gov.ie/en/INIS/Pages/check-irish-visa

Important – As part of the visa application, students must show evidence that they have access to at least €7,000. Students must also demonstrate that they or their sponsor have access to at least €7,000 for each subsequent year of study in addition to course fees for each of those years.

Step 2 – Register with the Immigration Authorities in Ireland (all students, regardless of entry visa requirement)

On arrival at Dublin Airport the passport will be stamped and students will have 90 days to register with the immigration authorities. Students need to re-register each year that they remain in Ireland. Students will be guided and supported through this process by the international offices of their college / university.

Fintech (Financial Technology)

Focus On - Finance

Ireland is a global centre for Financial Services, Technology and Innovation.

Over 430 Financial Services companies are operating from Ireland today, including 20 of the Top 25 Global Institutions.

Functions in Ireland include: corporate and wholesale banking, global transaction services, corporate and structured finance, treasury and cash management, trading, prime brokerage, securitisation, trade finance, foreign exchange and many others. In addition, many banks in Ireland have developed significant non-banking capabilities including insurance, asset/investment management and aviation financing.

17 of the Top 20 Global Banks are in Ireland including the Top 5 US & European Banks and 4 of the Top 5 Asian Banks.

Banks with established innovation labs in Ireland include Citigroup, Bank of America, Deutsche Bank, BNP Paribas, and J.P. Morgan.

Ireland is the global centre for aviation finance and aircraft leasing. More than half of the world's leased aircraft are now owned or managed in Ireland. An Irish-leased aircraft takes off every two seconds globally.
