TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. APPLICATION PROCESS OVERVIEW:

Entrants must complete the above application form and make a submission, making their case for the award of the scholarship. Application forms can be downloaded from the NCI website, www.ncirl.ie, and submitted by email or by post. If entrants cannot access the NCI website an application form can be forwarded to them by post. For more details see section 3: How to apply (below).

Applications will be accepted anytime during or after your final year of undergraduate study at NCI; but no later than 5pm on the 25th May. The recipients and unsuccessful applicants of the scholarships will be notified by e-mail. Please read all of the scholarship rules and additional information provided below prior to entering. By submitting an application, you are accepting the terms and conditions of the scholarship.

2. ELIGIBILITY:

The contest is open to all graduates of NCI undergraduate programmes. Employees of National College of Ireland, and the spouses, immediate family members, dependents, and/or other persons living in the same household, are not eligible to participate.

By submitting an application, entrants agree and consent to their personal details, his/her full name, area of residence, photographs and biographical information (in whole or in part), being published on the NCI website and in NCI publications, and other marketing material.

All applicants must be up to date with any fees payable to NCI in respect of their current or past undergraduate degree.

3. HOW TO APPLY:

Applicants may visit the NCI website at www.ncirl.ie and follow the instructions to submit their application by email, to Sonya Goulding at sgoulding@ncirl.ie. Applications must be received no later than 5pm on the 26th May.

4. JUDGING AND SELECTION OF WINNERS:

Applications will be judged by a panel of adjudicators, and applicants may be required to attend an interview with the panel so that the successful applicant can be chosen.

Judging will be based on the following criteria:

- 1. The genuine desire of the entrant to further their education
- 2. Their achievement to date in the face of significant challenges
- 3. The impact of the scholarship on their life

In the event of multiple applicants, a shortlist will be compiled for the judging panel and a further shortlisting may be required for interview with the judging panel.

Based on the applications and interviews, the judges will select one winner from amongst the entrants. The decision of the judges will be final and no correspondence will be entered into. Canvassing will automatically disqualify the applicant from the competition.

5. SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

The scholarship covers all enrolment fees nett of any additional grant funding (in respect of fees) that the student may have secured. It does not cover books, materials, computers, travel or subsistence costs.

6. WINNER NOTIFICATION

The recipient of the scholarship will be informed by e-mail, using the address details provided in their application form.

7. SCHOLARSHIP REDEMPTION

In order to redeem their scholarship the individual must comply with the programme entry requirements for their chosen course of study, timeline and the application process at National College of Ireland.
