## IRISH REFUGEE COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP

### TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- The closing date for this scholarship is 5pm, Saturday 6th June 2026.
- Applicants must meet the International Protection criteria and be ineligible for state Supports, such as the SUSI grant or Student Assistance Fund, for example. Successful applicants will be required to provide supporting documentation.
- Applicants must live within commuting distance to NCI.
- The scholarship will cover the Student Contribution Fee and a waiver of tuition fee, plus an allowance to cover transport, on-campus food, and the provision of a laptop device from NCI. The allowance will be assessed based on the circumstances of the individual student and will be solely at the discretion of NCI.
- Applications will be judged by a panel of adjudicators, and applicants may be required to attend an interview with the panel so that the successful applicant can be chosen.

*Judging will be based on the following criteria:*

1. The genuine desire of the entrant to further their education
  2. The impact of the scholarship on their life
- Students applying for this scholarship should fill in this form and return to NCI - [admissions@ncirl.ie](mailto:admissions@ncirl.ie) - AND must also apply for the programme through the CAO process in the normal way. Please note that the CAO early application deadline normally falls on 1st February each year and the CAO change of mind deadline normally falls on 1st July each year. Please consult [www.cao.ie](http://www.cao.ie) for confirmation of these dates. If you are a mature applicant (that is, if you are over the age of 23 on 1st January of your year of application), you are not required to submit a CAO application. Mature applicants are required to apply directly to NCI by submitting an online application form. Links to online application forms can be found on the Programme Information pages of the website [www.ncirl.ie](http://www.ncirl.ie).
  - This scholarship cannot be used in conjunction with any other NCI scholarships and no cash or other alternatives can be given. Note that all NCI courses are run subject to student numbers and availability can change.
  - The scholarship cannot be deferred and the recipient must commence their programme in the year the scholarship is awarded.
