International Entry Requirements

There are students from more than 80 countries studying at our campus, and we accept high school and degree qualifications from institutions around the world. There are 3 levels of entry requirements to consider:



1. Country

2. English Language Requirement

We accept various proficiency tests, including IELTS, Duolingo, TOEFL, and PTE. For a full list of accepted qualifications, please see our [English Language Requirements](#). Below is a table showing the IELTS and Duolingo requirements for our programmes for September 2026.

3. Programme

Undergraduate Entry Requirements

We accept high school qualifications from around the world as well as A Level and International Baccalaureate qualifications. Our undergraduate programmes require students to have completed Mathematics and English subjects within their high school qualification, and some programmes may have specific grade requirements.

Postgraduate Entry Requirements

Our masters programmes require students to have a bachelor degree (or international equivalent) from a recognised institution. In addition to the entry requirements from individual countries, certain courses also have cognate requirements. All Bachelor degrees	Approved high school diploma will be considered. Maths and English must be studied. Higher level of Maths required for BSc (Hons) in Data Science and BA (Hons) in Psychology. Some students may be referred to a foundation programme.
Higher Diploma in Science in Computing	Honours Bachelor's degree from a recognised institution in any major
MSc in Management MSc in International Business MA in Human Resource Management MSc in Accounting MSc in Business Analytics for Decision Makers	Honours Bachelor degree from a recognised institution in any major
MSc in Marketing	Honours Bachelor degree from a recognised institution in a Marketing, Business, Business Administration or Commerce.
MSc in Finance	Honours Bachelor degree from a recognised institution in any major containing significant modules in Maths/Statistics/Quantitative/Economics/Quantitative Finance related modules
MSc in Data Analytics MSc in Cloud Computing MSc in Cyber Security MSc in Artificial Intelligence	Honours Bachelor degree from a recognised institution in an IT/Computer Science major. Other STEM majors may be considered if they contain extensive IT/Computer Science/Programming modules. Other majors (i.e. Business) will not be considered.
MSc in Open Data Practice	Honours Bachelor degree from a recognised institution in an IT/Computer Science major. Majors in areas Bioscience, the Social Sciences, Psychology, or Library Science) will be considered based on potential Numerical/Computer assessment. Other Majors (e.g Business) will be considered on a case-by-case basis.
MSc in Fintech	Honours Bachelor degree from a recognised institution in an IT/Computer Science major OR a Finance major
MSc in AI for Business	Honours Bachelor degree from a recognised institution in a STEM major OR a business / humanities major with at least 1 IT and 1 Mathematics module included PLUS 3 years relevant working experience

Applicants who do not hold a standard honours degree may be considered based on relevant work or professional experience through our RPEL scheme.

A Foundation Programme is designed to prepare International Students for undergraduate study by improving their academic knowledge, English language skills, and understanding of college life. Pathway programmes are essential for students who do not meet direct entry requirements for our undergraduate degrees and serve as a stepping stone to their chosen degree.

Fee Payment to Confirm a Place

Due to our small class sizes, places are limited and programmes may fill quickly. Places are confirmed on a first come, first served basis when students pay their tuition fee. When all places are secured, a programme will close.

Students joining from visa required countries must pay the full fee to secure a place. Students from non-visa required countries and all students residing in Ireland can pay Euro 6,000 with the balance by payment plan.

NCI does not operate a deposit system, so partial payments of tuition fees does not guarantee a place on a programme. For full details on payment terms and conditions, please review our [International refund policy](#).

Payment to NCI should only be made through one of the official payment methods. NCI will never request payment of fees through any method other than the one listed on our website, or to any bank account other than the one listed there.

- **One username/password per agency:** If you require a reminder or assistance with your login credentials, please reach out to cynthia.fernandesvital@ncirl.ie
- **Student details and documents uploaded through the portal:** It is essential to enter the student's full name exactly as per their passport. Mistakes made in the student's name will result in a delay in processing. **Please do not use the "Middle Name" field** as it creates an error which will result in a delay to the application being processed by the admissions team. Students first and middle names should be entered in the First Name field.
- **Students must apply for 1 programme at a time:** To simplify the application process, students are advised to apply for one programme at a time to ensure accurate and efficient processing.



Offer Process

- **Conditional or Full Offers:** Students may receive conditional or full offers based on English proficiency, academic results, or both.
- **Scholarships:** Scholarship assessments take place during the application process and are listed in the offer letter for transparent communication of financial support opportunities.

Required Documents for ALL Programme Applications

To complete the application process for any NCI programme, the following documents are mandatory:

- **Transcripts and Graduation Certificate:** Original language documents and their English translations representing all completed studies. If the graduation certificate is not currently available, it can be submitted at a later stage.
- **English Language Certificate:** If available, please provide the English language certificate.
- **CV/Resume:** Students are required to submit a comprehensive CV or resume.
- **Passport:** A copy of the student's passport is necessary for identification and processing.
- **Immigration Card (for applicants already in Ireland):** If the student is already in Ireland, the immigration card is a mandatory document.



Additional Requirements for Specific Programme Applications

The following programmes necessitate additional documentation or tasks:

- **Personal Statement:** Required for ALL bachelor degree programmes, MSc Fintech, and MSc AI for Business applications.
